A Personal View – January 2023





As the New Year rolls in, I've been taking a look back at one or Village events that Eydon has held over the past decade or two. My thoughts wandered all the way back to the Millennium. Three permanent markers which celebrate the year 2000 come to mind. The first is the Holm Oak tree by the village green, which was mentioned in some previous notes of mine last year; the second is almost beside the Holm Oak, being the "EYDON 2000" standing stone. The third is the Sundial Clock on the south wall of St. Nicholas Church tower.

Whilst commemorating the Millennium, strictly speaking this Sundial wasn't erected in the year 2000, or even in the following year, but unveiled in 2003. So this year is its twentieth anniversary. After a design was approved by the Eydon parochial church council, and a Church faculty was obtained, funds had to be raised.

Choosing a sundial designer and a craftsman was interesting. We chose a talented expert, David Harber. David has his workshop in Oxfordshire, and tackled the task with perfection. First of all, he invited a small group of us to visit Oriel College where we viewed a similar sundial he was proposing for St Nicholas.

The (rather dark) picture shows David Harber (centre) with the late Dr Jeremy Catto from Eydon who was Principal Dean of Oriel (back to camera), and David Kench, PCC member for Works (left).

The second picture shows the Oriel College Millennium sundial already *in situ*. Have another look at the Eydon sundial and you will see the relationship. Over the past 20 years, David Harber has secured his place as the world's leading designer and manufacturer of sundials, outdoor features and similar works of art.

The unveiling ceremony of the Eydon sundial was on an appropriately beautiful sunny day. A

union flag was draped over the new work of art, and the idea was that the then oldest Eydon resident would tug a cord at the right moment to reveal the new Sundial. My job was to go to the top of the tower with the flag, and using some thin thread tie the flag to the buttresses at the tower summit so a good pull would break the cotton and the flag would come down at the correct moment.



Not all went to plan. The oldest resident was Ronnie Pettifer (yes, the owner of the walking stick displayed in The Royal Oak), who was profoundly hard of hearing. The Rector, the Rev. Tim Oakley, was to make a short speech followed by a Blessing for the Sundial (presumably to help it keep good time), and Ronnie would then be invited to release the flag. The Rector commenced his speech. Ronnie, thinking that was his cue to unveil, prematurely pulled the cord. I was still hanging onto the cord at the top of the tower, and was taken by surprise. I tripped and let go, nearly falling over in the process. The flag came hurtling down, just missing enveloping the Rector!

So in the hilarity that followed, no-one took any pictures of the unveiling. Nevertheless, Eydon's Millennium Sundial was well and truly unveiled. And it still keeps good time.
