A Personal View... February 2023

Some weeks ago, we watched a film on TV about the German occupation of the Channel Islands during WW2. In fact, we had seen "The Guernsey Literary and Potato Peel Society" at the cinema in 2018 when it was first released.


The film highlights the food shortage and subsequent rationing on the island. This brought back some memories of rationing at home, in Warwickshire. So I began to ferret around looking for an old ration book, in vain. But I came across a Membership badge for "The Beddgelert Custard Pie Society". This exclusive organisation would have been about as select as The Guernsey Potato Peel membership, and of similar vintage.

The B.C.P.S. drew its membership from a small group of

like-minded mountaineers and hill walkers who were in the habit of gathering on a regular basis every Easter, in



the pretty Snowdonia mountain village of Beddgelert. As a young boy, I was lucky enough to be the only junior member. My parents took me to Wales for our week's Easter holiday, staying in a small guest house in the village.



Annually on Easter Monday, we gathered in Beddgelert Village Hall with the object enjoying some friendly banter, and to consume quantities of custard pies. These were off-ration, as they were all home produced.

The hand-painted badge (in blue, green, red, white and custard yellow) depicts Snowdon against a blue sky, with a large custard pie at the foot. I recall the badges were crafted by a lady (Pam Williams, I think) who later married a Robert Cheney from Deddington. Robert's family owned a printing works in Banbury. Older readers may recall the business. This was a true custard pie romance.

In my ferreting, I did come across a National Identity Card issued in 1943, to my grandmother.

Surely, there is no good reason why Identity Cards shouldn't be used these days? They could replace all the stream of identity papers we are sometimes required to produce when banking, driving, purchasing alcohol, and dealing with government and other organisations.

Eydon is blessed with wealth of voluntary clubs and activities, but thankfully no identity cards are needed to participate...
