The Clerk has obtained the name of a Law firm retained on a NCALC Framework agreement for providing advice on such matters. It was agreed that an initial £1,000 was allocated to spend on this matter before the next meeting .

Councillor Training

Marie Reilly (MR) of NCALC (Northants County
Association of Local Councils) gave a presentation regarding training packages provided by the organisation.

There are 4 levels of Training; Foundation, Core, Leader and Advanced. The first two cover areas important for all Councillors. In general, there was a very positive response

After a discussion the PC agreed that such training would have positive impact on their ability to undertake their tasks and the Clerk was asked to arrange a schedule for the Foundation and Core levels to be completed by year end.

Planning Matters

2023/5721/FULL

45 High Street: New windows, internal layout, boiler. Hot water tanks and removal of ceiling. There were no objections.

2023/5761/FULL 1

Blacksmiths Lane. Double Storey extension.

Several residents, including neighbours laid out their views on the proposal.

A thorough review of the application, particularly comparing it to the village Design Statement (VDS) took place. Reservations about the use of timber cladding and metallic roof tiles in particular were discussed at length. It was noted that it was a large extension in a sensitive area, including the construction of a new retaining wall and a change of levels in the parking area immediately in front of the proposed extension.

After a wide ranging debate the following motion was passed unanimously:-

Eydon Parish Council objects to this application due to the size which dominates the plot, concerns about change of levels as regards the parking area on the street. Construction of a retaining wall which may impede access to other properties and consider the proposed materials are at complete odds with the Village Design Statement which states:

"In the historic core and Conservation Area of the village, this will mean buildings primarily in Eydon stone (or close match) with welsh blue-grey slate or plain tile roofing. It should follow the local vernacular style.

It need not exclude high quality contemporary designs, but these should complement (rather than contrast with) the materials, size, shape and mass of their neighbours.

Extensions and alterations should respect the site and building size, style etc of the original building and not appear to dominate.

Wherever possible, walls and historic buildings should be retained or renovated in a sympathetic manner.

Alteration should be sympathetic to its locality."

It is the view of Eydon Parish Council that this application is not suitable for the site in its

present form, which is one of the most important streets in the Village and a regular pedestrian thoroughfare. In particular, in relation to the timber cladding and roof materials which do not follow the vernacular style as outlined in the village Design Statement approved by West Northants Planning authority.

It was also agreed to write to Councillor Eastwood with supporting documentation.

Due to the busy agenda it was agreed after a motion as required to continue the meeting past 9.30pm.

The meeting closed at 10.00 pm.

The next planned meeting of the Parish Council is at 7.30 on Tuesday 12th September in the Village hall.

A Personal View... September 2023

I recently read somewhere that one should walk at least 4000 steps each day to remain reasonably fit. Maybe I'm simplifying an article at which, I confess, I only glanced.

But it set me thinking about 'normal' life here in Eydon. The late Syd Tyrrell in his book about our village "A Countryman's Tale" (Constable, 1973), relates how he recalls the commencement of the construction of the Great Central railway when he was just 6 years old. Before the coming of the railway, most people walked everywhere. Only the few well-off afforded horse transport. For example, after school, boys were sent several miles to meet loaded carts of coal to help them up the hills to Eydon from Cropredy or Marston Doles. No doubt at that time most people did their 4000 and more. Local historian and author Byron Rogers described* approaching Eydon 'rising from the flat Eastern fields to where the Cotswolds start, at Eydon on its hill like some Iron Age fort.' Rogers goes on to remind his readers that 'Eydon' is derived from "eyedune" meaning a hill or down, in an isolated place.

But back to walking. It's plainly obvious to us all in Eydon that whatever direction we walk, a hill needs ascending to return to our delightful village.

This brings me to the currently defunct Eydon Walking Group.



At one time this band of hikers drawn from all points of the village, and sometimes beyond, set off each month for a good hike of maybe five miles or more, visiting local areas and hostelries to finish for a meal and a drink. We rarely tired of returning up the hill, as The Royal Oak would be there providing some well-earned refreshment. As the years went on, our leaders discovered other villages and pubs ready to welcome thirsty and hungry walkers. Geoff Stretton, late of this Parish, was our last energetic organiser.

Sad that no-one as yet has stepped into his hiking boots to carry on that which was enjoyed by many of us. Sad, too, that The Royal Oak's doors are currently closed with no real knowledge of further plans. Maybe there is someone out there today, who can rejuvenate the Walking Group?

But, as for the Royal Oak....?
