The year 2024 is commencing as not one of the best for the Royal family.....



A Personal View... February 2024

Towards the end of the year 1992, some 32 years ago, an elderly gentleman sat at his desk and composed a letter to his old boss sympathising with her about the rotten year she had endured. The letter suggested that in fact the year had turned out to be an *annus horribilis*.

The writer was Sir Edward Ford late of Eydon Hall, and his correspondent was, of course, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth. Sir Edward had been the Queen's personal private secretary for some 20 years previously. The *annus horribilis* in question had included the break up of the marriage of the Queen's second son, the divorce of her daughter, the beginning of the break between her eldest son and his wife, and the disastrous fire at Windsor Castle.

At that time over a period of some months, I had many conversations with Sir Edward in his London home. He related many memories of his time in Eydon, and of his work at the Palace. The picture shows him later in his life, in the very study where he composed the *annus horribilis* letter. Sir Edward had little sympathy for Prince Andrew and his separation from Sarah Ferguson, he was upset about Princess Anne's divorce, and had absolutely no comment about Prince Charles' problems with Diana. As for the Windsor fire, he was devastated.





Here we are three decades later, only weeks into a new year and already the Royal family has been hard hit with several substantial problems. King Charles himself, at time of writing, is due any day to have a prostate operation. His daughter in law is in hospital, apparently having undergone what must be a severe tummy operation. And we hear that Prince Andrew's wife/partner has skin cancer, which indicates that her previous cancer condition is still active.

King Charles needs all the support he can muster. Even the most hardened republican must feel sympathetic to the problems he and his family face.

Recently, the Government has released an official photograph of King Charles, with the suggestion it be hung in public places throughout the country. The photograph is available to all Town Halls, Councils, public buildings, free of charge. From this month, it is even available to Parish Councils for hanging in Village Halls.

Have a look at the picture, which shows the King in full naval uniform as Admiral of the Fleet. This is the picture being distributed to our Embassies and Consulates across the world. It will be sent to the world's press. The coverage will be immense. However, I do query the choice of dress. We are not an aggressive nation. The picture is more reminiscent of a minor south American dictator, not the image of a peace-loving British Monarch. We don't see European or Scandinavian Monarchs officially photographed dressed up like a Christmas tree. Surely, a more discreet picture like the lesser publicised picture below, would be more suitable?

We all wish His Majesty a speedy and full recovery from his operation, which it is understood is *not* cancer-related, and let's hope the rest of 2024 is happy and healthy.
